Remember Only 14 clubs are allowed in your bag for competitions.

A mobile phone is accepted in case of an emergency, but it can't be used to provide information that may help you in a competition! It must remain on silent in your golf bag.

Basic Rules and Etiquette

Playing the game

- Honesty is very important in golf as it is in every other aspect of your life. It is a game of trust and if you cheat, you cheat yourself and betray the trust of other players. Once you have lost the trust of other players, that trust is very difficult to regain, so be sure to count all your shots.

Before a round

- Check notice boards for any relevant information.
- Ensure you have a rules booklet.
- Sign the entry sheet and pay your entrance fee in Club Shop prior to starting your round.
- Arrive early for your tee time – be on the tee at least 10 minutes before you are due to tee off.
- Shake hands and introduce yourselves to playing partner, showing them your ball with markings.

During the round on the course

- Mobile phones to be on silent and kept in bag.
- Let groups through if you are slow or know you will be holding up play whilst searching for a ball.
- Avoid slow play – keep up with the group in front, to comply with England Golf Pace of Play rules.
- Rake bunkers.
- Flag sticks - don't drop them on the green or damage around the hole.
- Replace divots.
- Repair pitch marks on the green.
- Wait to take shots until the players in the group in front are out of your range.
- Consider other players by not walking on your playing partners lines on the green.
- Consider other players by not distracting them when they are taking shots by moving, making a noise or standing too close. Give players space.
- Consider where you leave your trolley. Ensure it isn't in the way of other players and it is placed in the best position to keep up the pace of play.

At the end of the round

- Take off any hat and shake hands with your playing partner(s).
- Ensure your scorecard is completed correctly.
- Hand in your score card following club score entry procedure.

Handicap Information

All membership categories of the Phoenix Course are entitled to gain a handicap. Note this does not apply to Hadzor Course membership as it is a Par 3 course and not an England Golf measured course.



World Handicapping System

- Official Handicapping System for all golfers.
- From November 2020 this has replaced CONGU for both males and females.

How do I get a Handicap?

- Submit cards played on the Phoenix Course totalling 54 holes played.
- 9 Hole membership submit 6 x 9 holes played.
- 18 Hole membership, the norm is to submit 3 x 18 holes played. However, any permutation of 9 hole and 18-hole cards may be submitted but **must total a minimum of 54 holes**.
- You will be awarded a Handicap reflecting your standard of play against the par for the course.
- All rounds for handicap purposes **MUST be played at your Home Club** and cards submitted within a six-month period.
- Cards will not be accepted if **three or more temporary greens** are in play.

From which tees do I play to gain my handicap?

- Gents - Yellow Tees
- Ladies - Red Tees.

Who can mark my handicap card?

- All handicap cards **must** be marked by a member of Gaudet-Luce who holds a handicap.

What information MUST be on the card?

- Player's name and date played.
- Card clearly marked "For First Handicap".
- Total strokes played at each hole.
- Signature of player.
- Printed name and signature of marker.

Where do I submit my cards?

- Place your cards in the handicap box in clubhouse by the computer. Please hand them in as soon as played so that the system can be updated

What happens next?

- Your handicap will be calculated by England Golf, entered onto the club database and registered. Please note that England Golf require an email address and date of birth for them to process a handicap.
- You are now eligible to play in handicap qualifying competitions but always check entry rules for any handicap restrictions that may apply.

What is my CDH ID Number?

- You will find your “CDH ID Number” next to your name on your handicap certificate. CDH stands for the Central Database for Handicaps. Handicapping information is collected electronically from all clubs when they close qualifying competitions. The information is available on the Internet for reference by individual players, clubs, and tournament organising bodies.
- A CDH ID Number is a unique lifetime number which allows a player to be registered for handicapping purposes. You will need this number to enter competitions played away from your home club. All club members are automatically members of England Golf and are issued with an England Golf/County membership card showing your CDH ID Number – these are now electronic, and can be downloaded by registering at www.Englandgolf.org

Competition Scoring Formats

Medal Play	A round where you count every shot that is played in a round
Stableford	A round where you score points on each hole for the number of shots you take, taking your handicap into account Bogey (1 over par) = 1 point Par (level par) = 2 points Birdie (1 under par) = 3 points Eagle (2 under par) = 4 points Albatross (3 under par) = 5 points
Match Play	A round where you play against each other individually or as a team, hole by hole. You can win, lose or halve a hole. Once a player is up by a number of holes which is less than that remaining to be played, then that player will have won the match.
Knockout Competitions	A match play format either as an individual or a team.
Pairs Betterball Stableford	A round where two players play as a team using the stableford format. With the best points score on each hole being the one used for the team.
Bogey / Par	A round where you play match play against the course. A gross or nett birdie or better wins the hole. A nett par means you level the hole, and a nett bogey or worse means you lose the hole.
Flag Competition	A round where players have a total number of shots equivalent to the par of the course plus their handicap to complete the round. They then play the round until their allotted number of shots runs out and they place a flag in the ground at the place where their number of shots run out.
Foursomes	A round with two players play as a team, but instead of playing their own ball, the players play take alternate shots with the same ball and tee off alternate holes
Greensomes	A round where two players play as a team, but each player tees off and then the team decides which ball to play in alternate strokes for the remainder of the hole
Texas Scramble	A round where up to four players play as a team. All players tee off, but the team uses the best shot of the four to play next. All players then play this ball and again they choose the best ball and so on until the ball is holed out.
Medford	The best Stableford score(s) are taken from the best Medal score(s) and the winner is the player with the lowest 'Medford' score.
Order of Merit – OOM	Accumulation of points based on finishes in ladies qualifying competitions throughout the year.

Filling Out a Scorecard

Before teeing off simply fill in the top section of the scorecard. Although you are only responsible for writing your course handicap, your gross score, and card signed by both player and marker, as without 1 of these you can be disqualified. The ladies committee ask our members to add the following to aid our competition secretaries with their job, as agreed with the Competitions Chair at the start of 2023.

- Name of the competition being played for example – for example Ladies Club Championship
- The date and the tee time that you start your round – 10/06/2023 / 12:04
- The colour tee you are playing from – white / yellow / red
- Your name (Player A) and that of your marker or playing partner(s) if a team event (Players B, C & D as applicable)
- Your handicap Index/Course Handicap/Strokes rec'd and that of your marker or playing partner(s) as above
- The 'name boxes' are not ideal for some of our names - if you cannot fit your name in can we ask for your Initial and Surname i.e. A N Other, and **not** a shortened version of your Christian Name and Surname, i.e., Annie O.

Please note that failure to fill out a card with all the correct details will mean that you will be disqualified from the competition. If you are unsure, please ask for help.

N.B if you are playing a 9-hole competition please refer to the allowance chart situated on the board in the ladies changing room and use the correct 9-hole score card from the pro shop

Markers score – yours!

determines how many shots you receive over par depending on your handicap, for example in Stableford and Matchplay formats

- At the end of each hole, it is good practice to check your score for that hole with your playing partner(s). Compare the scores you have marked with that of your playing partner(s), they should match yours and you should agree each other's scores.
- At the end of the round, both you and your Marker MUST sign your card-failure to do so is disqualification.
- Make sure all details are completed on the card.
- You are responsible for entering your current Handicap Index - playing off an incorrect high handicap will result in disqualification; if its incorrectly low, that handicap stands for that competition.
- Carefully check your scores per hole-signing for an incorrect score is disqualification.
- Hand in your card as soon as possible after the round following club procedure.
- You may be asked to input your results onto the club computer system, enter results carefully, checking they match the results on your card; it is good practice to do this task with your playing partners. Once you have accepted your score on the Psi terminal you will be unable to amend, if you make a mistake, please notify the competition secretary as soon as possible.
- Always remember, the correct completion and signing of the score card is vital, you cannot be disqualified for computer typing errors, but you can be disqualified for an incorrect score card.
- Always check and ask if you need some help!

Competition Entry Procedures for Club V1 Computer System Competitions

Competition Entry

- Enter competitions by:
 - a. Using Touch Screen in Club House Lobby: Enter name and click on comp required
 - b. How Did I Do website, register at www.howdidido.com, click on comp required
- Competition Secretary closes competition for entry, completes the draw and issues start times to Players via email
- Players can also view their start times on the club touch screen or at www.howdidido.com

On Day of Competition

- Players report to pro-shop to register and pay entry fee for competition – failure to do this prior to the competition will result in disqualification.
- On completion of round, players enter their scores on to the system using the touchscreen and place their cards in the white box
- After competition is complete and all cards entered, the competitions secretary will check the cards, close the competition, and publish results
- All can view results on www.howdidido.com or club touch screen
- Everyone can view their playing record and print handicap certificate on www.howdidido.com

If a Player wishes to cancel out of a Competition

- If competition still open for entry: Click “remove me” on either touch screen at the club or on www.howdidido.com
- If competition closed: Contact the Section Competition Secretary and Pro Shop
- To cancel on the day of the competition: Contact the Golf Shop ASAP on 01905 796375

NB: Failure to notify cancellation can result in a four week ban from club competitions.
Refer to Club Rule for “No Show” in competitions

Competition Entry Procedures for Non - Club V1 Computer System Competitions

Some competitions are “Fun” competitions and are not entered onto the Computer System, entry to these can be made as follows:

- Competition Secretary will post a notice and entry sheet on the relevant notice board
- For Club Mixed Fun Competitions, the entry sheet will be on the Captain’s Noticeboard

Competition Entry

- Enter competition by adding name to entry sheet on notice board
- Competition Secretary takes sheet down, completes the draw, and issues start times to players via email or by posting the start sheet on the notice board.

On Day of Competition

- Players report to pro-shop to register and pay entry fee for competition
- On completion of round players place their cards in the white box or hand to competition secretary on the day
- After competition is complete and all cards returned, the competitions secretary will check the cards, close the competition and publish results
- Results will be posted either on the section notice board or via email

If a Player wishes to cancel out of a Competition

- Before the draw has been posted: cross name off sheet
- After the draw has been posted but before day of comp: contact comps secretary as above
- On day of competition: Contact the Golf Shop ASAP on 01905 796375, if office is closed, please leave a message or contact the Competition secretary

Away Competitions

This includes all competitions played at outside venues, including other clubs to which you may belong, County competitions, Open and National competitions. You are responsible for ensuring your score is returned to your Home Club (i.e., the club which holds your handicap).

Handicap Qualifying Competitions:

- The host club will send the results electronically to your home club via the CDH system. This can occasionally take a couple of days, so it is advisable to check with your handicap or competition secretary at your home club that they have received the results and your handicap has been adjusted accordingly.

Non-Qualifying Competitions:

- You are obliged to return competitive away scores to your Home Club (your original score card, a copy, or a photo)
- This includes all singles, team events, Am-Am, 4 Ball Betterball. Exceptions are Texas Scramble; Foursomes and Greensomes.
- Return your scores to the Handicap secretary. These will not directly affect your handicap but will be used as evidence of ability in the Annual Review.

Ladies Section Competitions

L1. MONTHLY MEDAL Held in accordance with EG rules and is a stroke play competition, 95% Course handicap. An equal number of medals will be held on Thursdays and Saturday/Sunday between April and October. Each medal is a separate competition and may be played on either or both days. The player with the best differential scores at the end of the 12 month period, regardless of handicap, will go forward to play in the EG Regional Final for the Race to Woodall Spa Grand Final. Entry into any Gaudet Luce Club strokeplay competitions means automatic entry into the EG Race to Woodall Spa. Please see England Golf web site for details. A 9-hole competition is also included within the 18-hole competition.

L2. STABLEFORD 95% Course handicap Stableford played from April to October on Thursdays and weekends. Players may enter the Thursday and weekend competitions. A 9-hole competition is also included within the 18-hole competition.

L3. TROPHY COMPETITION Players must have a Handicap Index, be an 18-hole member and played in 3 Gaudet–Luce ladies section 18 hole qualifying competitions in a rolling year (1 of which must be a Club Medal). 9-hole competitions do not qualify and are for handicap purposes only. They must also have union and capitation fees paid to be eligible to accept prizes in the following trophy events. For Mixed Trophies the Gents/Seniors must have played in 3 club 18-hole qualifying competitions. Max Course Handicap 36 (32.2 H.I) Gents Max Course Handicap of 28 (25.9 H.I)

L3.1 Corinne Harrison Foursomes, Foursomes Medal, played off 50% of combined handicap. A trophy is presented to the winners and money vouchers for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place, dependent on numbers playing. The competition is played in conjunction with the Peugeot Foursomes (stableford), a national competition. This event will have an alternate day arranged for the Thursday prior to the main weekend date.

L3.2 Mayor's Trophy Flag competition, 95% Course handicap. A trophy to the winner plus money vouchers to the first three places. A non-qualifying competition for handicap adjustment only but does count towards number of competitions in a rolling year.

L3.3 Challenge Trophy 95% Course handicap, Medal.

L3.4. Maurice Jones Shield 95% Course handicap Stableford competition.

L3.5 Ladies Club Championship Medal. For home members only. This is a gross competition - the lady with the lowest gross is the Club Champion and is awarded the trophy and a money voucher for first place. There is also a prize voucher for the second lowest gross. The lady with the best nett score (95% Course handicap) receives 3rd prize.

L3.6 Champion of Champions Medal, 95% Course handicap. Ladies who have been competition winners or runners up during the previous 12 months (1st Aug – 31st July) are eligible to compete providing they have played the required 3 qualifying competitions. The winner receives a trophy and is presented with a cut glass trophy to keep at home for 12 months.

L3.7 Ladies v Seniors Plate Played between the two sections for a plate held by the winning section for twelve months. No entry fees. This is also combined with the Presidents Cup Ladies V Seniors match. Please see Mixed competitions below.

L3.8 Mixed Foursomes, Foursomes Medal off 50% of combined handicap. A trophy for the winners and vouchers dependent on numbers playing.

L3.9 P. J. Fernihough Memorial Trophy Bogey/95% Course handicap qualifying competition. A trophy to the winner and money vouchers for the first three placings.

L3.10 The Lincolnshire Bowl and Ping Competition Fourball Betterball Stableford 85% handicap. To be played in conjunction with and to the same rules as the Ping National competition. Handicap limit 45 (is for the Ping entry)

L3.11 Binnie Vase Pairs Greensomes, Stroke play 60% lower handicap + 40% higher handicap. Vouchers to first three places. This competition is exempt from normal qualifying rules for trophies.

L3.12 Hi Jinx Trophy 10-hole Medford competition. This competition is exempt from normal qualifying rules for trophies.

L3.13 Turkey Trot Non-Qualifying 9-hole fun competition. Open to Lady members with or without Competition Handicaps. Draw sheet for entry on Ladies notice board. Played on the Phoenix course.

L3.14 The Austin Trophy Fourball Betterball Stableford 85% handicap. Mixed Pairs. Handicap limit men 28/Ladies 36

L3.15 The Sanctum Shield Stableford, 4 clubs and a putter. Handicap limit 36

L3.16 The Heathcote Trophy Stableford, full handicap, non-qualifier, double scores on par 3's. Handicap limit 36

M. MIXED EVENTS Entry sheets for mixed competitions may be posted on the notice boards or entry via HDID. Fiddlers Trophy August Bank Holiday competition. Stableford off full handicap. Entry is £3 per player.

Presidents Cup is an intersection league, the ladies play against each section on set dates throughout the year. The format is normally matchplay. When playing against the seniors this match is also combined with the Ladies V Seniors Plate (a trophy competition) [see L3.7](#)

Captain's Day Captain's choice of format. Shot gun starts with food and prizes after the golf. Fun Competitions Teams are drawn together to play a variety of formats during the year. Rules and entry conditions are posted on the notice board.

Captains Cup Trophy Sponsored by Sam Waters and Ade Cook. Past/Present Captain and Gaudet member guest. Betterball Pairs Stableford. 85% handicap. Gents' whites/ladies red. Own SI/Par. Entry £6 Per Pair (entry L3 applies)

Ping Competition Mixed Fourball Betterball Stableford 85% handicap. To be played in conjunction with and to the same rules as the Ping National competition. Handicap limit 54

ALTERNATE DAY COMPETITIONS

The main lady's competition day is Saturday/Sunday, any alternate day will be held within 7 days prior to the main day usually on the Thursday.

- If for any reason the Thursday day comp was cancelled/abandoned, then the comp will continue to only run on the weekend day.
- If the weekend day comp was cancelled/abandoned (that being the main comp day), then that day can be rearranged if a suitable date can be found.

Ladies Fixtures

All of the ladies fixtures can also be found on the Gaudet-Luce website under diary or if you are registered on howdidido.com, once you have gained a handicap, you can find them in the home club section under ladies fixtures.
